➔ **STREET OPERATIONS DEPARTMENT**

• **SWEEPING**

- Monday: Northend

• **PAVEMENT MARKINGS & ROAD STRIPING**

Street Operations Department will continue striping roads and refreshing crosswalks this week. There will be intermittent lane closures while crews are painting. Drivers are advised to watch for traffic control to stay safe and avoid driving through fresh paint. Please expect delays while work is being done.

• **MILLING & PAVING**

- **Monday, August 16 through Thursday, August 19**
Street crews will be milling and paving North Grant Avenue from West Custer Street to West Bridger Street, and West Sherman Street from North Grant Avenue to the North Grant Alley. No parking will be allowed on the streets from 6:30 am until work is completed each day. Motorists are advised to use caution and expect delays in the work areas.

• **SIGNAL WORK**

- **Wednesday, August 18 & Thursday, August 19**
Signal maintenance will be performed at Clark St and 15th St on Wednesday, and Center St and 15th St on Thursday, beginning at 6:30 am both days. The signals will be inoperable during the maintenance. Crews will have temporary stop signs in place for the duration of the signal work. There may be intermittent lane closures while work is being performed. Motorists are advised to use caution and expect delays in the area.

➔ **WATER DEPARTMENT**

WATER LINE INSTALL

Crews with the City of Pocatello Water Department will continue replacing the water main line on North Grant Avenue. The total project area will span over 4,500 feet on North Grant Avenue from Center Street to West Day Street. Crews will start at the intersection of North Grant Avenue and West Bridger Avenue, continuing north to complete the work east of Irving Middle School before the new school year begins. During the project, road closures and detours will occur. Motorists are asked to use alternate routes when possible. Crews will work between the hours of 6:30 a.m. to approximately 6:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Access to the construction area will be restricted and sections of the street will be completely closed while workers are digging. However, every effort will be made to provide local access to the area when possible. Parking will also be restricted in the construction zone and residents are asked to park all vehicles away from the area during the day. At the close of each day, access will be restored to all properties.

➔ **WATER POLLUTION CONTROL**

JETTING SEWER LINES

Crews will be jetting sewer lines throughout the city. Motorists may experience delays or lane closures while crews are performing the work.

- Dig Em Up will be installing a new sanitary sewer line on South Grant Avenue, from 2207 South Grant Avenue to the intersection of South Grant Avenue and Hawkweed Drive. The road will be fully closed during working hours, with one lane open for travel at night. Construction is anticipated to last until August 20, 2021. - Idaho Materials and Construction will be closing the 200 block of North Main Street to install a fire line at 224 North Main Street. The road will be closed Tuesday August 17 through Wednesday August 18. A detour will be provided. Contact information will be Kodey Johnson, 208-240-0388. Motorists are advised to use alternate routes and expect delays in the work areas.
